(Genesis 17:1) When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to him and said, "I am God Almighty ; walk before me and be blameless.

(Genesis 32:10) I am unworthy of all the kindness and faithfulness you have shown your servant. I had only my staff when I crossed this Jordan, but now I have become two groups.

(Leviticus 19:2) "Speak to the entire assembly of Israel and say to them: 'Be holy because I, the LORD your God, am holy.

(Deuteronomy 4:23) Be careful not to forget the covenant of the LORD your God that he made with you; do not make for yourselves an idol in the form of anything the LORD your God has forbidden.

(Deuteronomy 4:29) But if from there you seek the LORD your God, you will find him if you look for him with all your heart and with all your soul.

(Deuteronomy 4:31) For the LORD your God is a merciful God; he will not abandon or destroy you or forget the covenant with your forefathers, which he confirmed to them by oath.

(Deuteronomy 4:39) Acknowledge and take to heart this day that the LORD is God in heaven above and on the earth below. There is no other.

(Deuteronomy 4:40) Keep his decrees and commands, which I am giving you today, so that it may go well with you and your children after you and that you may live long in the land the LORD your God gives you for all time.

(Deuteronomy 6:5) Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength.

(Deuteronomy 6:6) These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts.

(Deuteronomy 7:9) Know therefore that the LORD your God is God; he is the faithful God, keeping his covenant of love to a thousand generations of those who love him and keep his commands.

(Deuteronomy 10:12) And now, O Israel, what does the LORD your God ask of you but to fear the LORD your God, to walk in all his ways, to love him, to serve the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul,

(Deuteronomy 10:20) Fear the LORD your God and serve him. Hold fast to him and take your oaths in his name.

(Deuteronomy 11:26) See, I am setting before you today a blessing and a curse

(Deuteronomy 11:27) the blessing if you obey the commands of the LORD your God that I am giving you today;

(Deuteronomy 11:28) the curse if you disobey the commands of the LORD your God and turn from the way that I command you today by following other gods, which you have not known.

(Deuteronomy 31:6) Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the LORD your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you."

(Joshua 1:5) No one will be able to stand up against you all the days of your life. As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will never leave you nor forsake you.

(Joshua 1:6) "Be strong and courageous, because you will lead these people to inherit the land I swore to their forefathers to give them.

(Joshua 1:8) Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful.

(Joshua 22:29) "Far be it from us to rebel against the LORD and turn away from him today by building an altar for burnt offerings, grain offerings and sacrifices, other than the altar of the LORD our God that stands before his tabernacle."

(Joshua 23:11) So be very careful to love the LORD your God.

(Joshua 24:14) "Now fear the LORD and serve him with all faithfulness. Throw away the gods your forefathers worshiped beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the LORD.

(Joshua 24:15) But if serving the LORD seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your forefathers served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."

(Judges 16:28) Then Samson prayed to the LORD, "O Sovereign LORD, remember me. O God, please strengthen me just once more, and let me with one blow get revenge on the Philistines for my two eyes."

(1 Samuel 12:24) But be sure to fear the LORD and serve him faithfully with all your heart; consider what great things he has done for you.

(1 Samuel 16:7) But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The LORD does not look at the things man looks at. Man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart."

(2 Samuel 15:26) But if he says, 'I am not pleased with you,' then I am ready; let him do to me whatever seems good to him."

(2 Samuel 22:31) "As for God, his way is perfect; the word of the LORD is flawless. He is a shield for all who take refuge in him.

(1 Kings 8:57) May the LORD our God be with us as he was with our fathers; may he never leave us nor forsake us.

(1 Kings 8:58) May he turn our hearts to him, to walk in all his ways and to keep the commands, decrees and regulations he gave our fathers.

(1 Chronicles 16:11) Look to the LORD and his strength; seek his face always.

(1 Chronicles 28:9) "And you, my son Solomon, acknowledge the God of your father, and serve him with wholehearted devotion and with a willing mind, for the LORD searches every heart and understands every motive behind the thoughts. If you seek him, he will be found by you; but if you forsake him, he will reject you forever.

(1 Chronicles 29:5) for the gold work and the silver work, and for all the work to be done by the craftsmen. Now, who is willing to consecrate himself today to the LORD?"

(2 Chronicles 13:10) "As for us, the LORD is our God, and we have not forsaken him. The priests who serve the LORD are sons of Aaron, and the Levites assist them.

(2 Chronicles 15:2) He went out to meet Asa and said to him, "Listen to me, Asa and all Judah and Benjamin. The LORD is with you when you are with him. If you seek him, he will be found by you, but if you forsake him, he will forsake you.

(2 Chronicles 29:5) and said: "Listen to me, Levites! Consecrate yourselves now and consecrate the temple of the LORD, the God of your fathers. Remove all defilement from the sanctuary.

(Nehemiah 8:10) Nehemiah said, "Go and enjoy choice food and sweet drinks, and send some to those who have nothing prepared. This day is sacred to our Lord. Do not grieve, for the joy of the LORD is your strength."

(Job 28:28) And he said to man, 'The fear of the Lord--that is wisdom, and to shun evil is understanding.'

(Psalms 1:1) Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked or stand in the way of sinners or sit in the seat of mockers.

(Psalms 1:2) But his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night.

(Psalms 1:3) He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers.

(Psalms 1:6) For the LORD watches over the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.

(Psalms 2:6) "I have installed my King on Zion, my holy hill."

(Psalms 22:25) From you comes the theme of my praise in the great assembly; before those who fear you will I fulfill my vows.

(Psalms 23:1) A psalm of David. The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not be in want.

(Psalms 24:3) Who may ascend the hill of the LORD? Who may stand in his holy place?

(Psalms 24:4) He who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not lift up his soul to an idol or swear by what is false.

(Psalms 24:5) He will receive blessing from the LORD and vindication from God his Savior.

(Psalms 25:2) in you I trust, O my God. Do not let me be put to shame, nor let my enemies triumph over me.

(Psalms 25:3) No one whose hope is in you will ever be put to shame, but they will be put to shame who are treacherous without excuse.

(Psalms 25:5) guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long.

(Psalms 31:14) But I trust in you, O LORD; I say, "You are my God."

(Psalms 34:8) Taste and see that the LORD is good; blessed is the man who takes refuge in him.

(Psalms 37:4) Delight yourself in the LORD and he will give you the desires of your heart.

(Psalms 37:28) For the LORD loves the just and will not forsake his faithful ones. They will be protected forever, but the offspring of the wicked will be cut off;

(Psalms 37:37) Consider the blameless, observe the upright; there is a future for the man of peace.

(Psalms 40:8) I desire to do your will, O my God; your law is within my heart."

(Psalms 43:3) Send forth your light and your truth, let them guide me; let them bring me to your holy mountain, to the place where you dwell.

(Psalms 50:14) Sacrifice thank offerings to God, fulfill your vows to the Most High,

(Psalms 51:10) Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me.

(Psalms 62:1) For the director of music. For Jeduthun. A psalm of David. My soul finds rest in God alone; my salvation comes from him.

(Psalms 62:2) He alone is my rock and my salvation; he is my fortress, I will never be shaken.

(Psalms 71:5) For you have been my hope, O Sovereign LORD, my confidence since my youth.

(Psalms 73:28) But as for me, it is good to be near God. I have made the Sovereign LORD my refuge; I will tell of all your deeds.

(Psalms 86:11) Teach me your way, O LORD, and I will walk in your truth; give me an undivided heart, that I may fear your name.

(Psalms 103:1) Of David. Praise the LORD, O my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name.

(Psalms 103:2) Praise the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits--

(Psalms 103:3) who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases,

(Psalms 103:4) who redeems your life from the pit and crowns you with love and compassion,

(Psalms 103:17) But from everlasting to everlasting the Lord's love is with those who fear him, and his righteousness with their children's children--

(Psalms 103:18) with those who keep his covenant and remember to obey his precepts.

(Psalms 111:10) The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom; all who follow his precepts have good understanding. To him belongs eternal praise.

(Psalms 116:12) How can I repay the LORD for all his goodness to me?

(Psalms 119:9) How can a young man keep his way pure? By living according to your word.

(Psalms 119:33) Teach me, O LORD, to follow your decrees; then I will keep them to the end.

(Psalms 119:93) I will never forget your precepts, for by them you have preserved my life.

(Psalms 119:105) Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path.

(Psalms 119:165) Great peace have they who love your law, and nothing can make them stumble.

(Psalms 139:23) Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts.

(Psalms 139:24) See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.

(Psalms 143:10) Teach me to do your will, for you are my God; may your good Spirit lead me on level ground.

(Proverbs 2:6) For the LORD gives wisdom, and from his mouth come knowledge and understanding.

(Proverbs 2:7) He holds victory in store for the upright, he is a shield to those whose walk is blameless,

(Proverbs 3:1) My son, do not forget my teaching, but keep my commands in your heart,

(Proverbs 3:5) Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding;

(Proverbs 3:6) in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight.

(Proverbs 3:7) Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the LORD and shun evil.

(Proverbs 4:13) Hold on to instruction, do not let it go; guard it well, for it is your life.

(Proverbs 4:18) The path of the righteous is like the first gleam of dawn, shining ever brighter till the full light of day.

(Proverbs 4:19) But the way of the wicked is like deep darkness; they do not know what makes them stumble.

(Proverbs 4:23) Above all else, guard your heart, for it is the wellspring of life.

(Proverbs 4:27) Do not swerve to the right or the left; keep your foot from evil.

(Proverbs 8:17) I love those who love me, and those who seek me find me.

(Proverbs 11:19) The truly righteous man attains life, but he who pursues evil goes to his death.

(Proverbs 12:28) In the way of righteousness there is life; along that path is immortality.

(Proverbs 13:9) The light of the righteous shines brightly, but the lamp of the wicked is snuffed out.

(Proverbs 13:13) He who scorns instruction will pay for it, but he who respects a command is rewarded.

(Proverbs 14:27) The fear of the LORD is a fountain of life, turning a man from the snares of death.

(Proverbs 15:9) The LORD detests the way of the wicked but he loves those who pursue righteousness.

(Proverbs 23:17) Do not let your heart envy sinners, but always be zealous for the fear of the LORD.

(Proverbs 23:26) My son, give me your heart and let your eyes keep to my ways,

(Ecclesiastes 11:9) Be happy, young man, while you are young, and let your heart give you joy in the days of your youth. Follow the ways of your heart and whatever your eyes see, but know that for all these things God will bring you to judgment.

(Ecclesiastes 12:1) Remember your Creator in the days of your youth, before the days of trouble come and the years approach when you will say, "I find no pleasure in them"--

(Ecclesiastes 12:12) Be warned, my son, of anything in addition to them. Of making many books there is no end, and much study wearies the body.

(Ecclesiastes 12:13) Now all has been heard; here is the conclusion of the matter: Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man.

(Isaiah 40:29) He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak.

(Isaiah 40:30) Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall;

(Isaiah 40:31) but those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.

(Isaiah 41:10) So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.

(Isaiah 43:1) But now, this is what the LORD says-- he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine.

(Lamentations 3:24) I say to myself, "The LORD is my portion; therefore I will wait for him."

(Micah 6:8) He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the LORD require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.

(Habakkuk 3:18) yet I will rejoice in the LORD, I will be joyful in God my Savior.

(Habakkuk 3:19) The Sovereign LORD is my strength; he makes my feet like the feet of a deer, he enables me to go on the heights. For the director of music. On my stringed instruments.

(Matthew 5:6) Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

(Matthew 5:8) Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

(Matthew 6:20) But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal.

(Matthew 6:33) But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

(Matthew 7:7) "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.

(Matthew 7:13) "Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it.

(Matthew 7:14) But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it.

(Matthew 7:21) "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only he who does the will of my Father who is in heaven.

(Matthew 10:22) All men will hate you because of me, but he who stands firm to the end will be saved.

(Matthew 10:32) "Whoever acknowledges me before men, I will also acknowledge him before my Father in heaven.

(Matthew 10:33) But whoever disowns me before men, I will disown him before my Father in heaven.

(Matthew 11:28) "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.

(Matthew 11:29) Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.

(Matthew 11:30) For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

(Matthew 16:26) What good will it be for a man if he gains the whole world, yet forfeits his soul? Or what can a man give in exchange for his soul?

(Matthew 19:17) "Why do you ask me about what is good?" Jesus replied. "There is only One who is good. If you want to enter life, obey the commandments."

(Matthew 24:4) Jesus answered: "Watch out that no one deceives you.

(Matthew 25:23) "His master replied, 'Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!'

(Matthew 28:20) and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

(Mark 13:37) What I say to you, I say to everyone: "Watch!"

(Luke 1:50) His mercy extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation.

(Luke 2:52) And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men.

(Luke 8:15) But the seed on good soil stands for those with a noble and good heart, who hear the word, retain it, and by persevering produce a crop.

(Luke 10:42) but only one thing is needed. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."

(Luke 11:28) He replied, "Blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and obey it."

(Luke 12:48) But the one who does not know and does things deserving punishment will be beaten with few blows. From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked.

(Luke 16:10) "Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much.

(Luke 17:32) Remember Lot's wife!

(Luke 21:36) Be always on the watch, and pray that you may be able to escape all that is about to happen, and that you may be able to stand before the Son of Man."

(John 1:4) In him was life, and that life was the light of men.

(John 1:12) Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God--

(John 1:16) From the fullness of his grace we have all received one blessing after another.

(John 3:16) "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

(John 3:36) Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life, but whoever rejects the Son will not see life, for God's wrath remains on him."

(John 5:24) "I tell you the truth, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be condemned; he has crossed over from death to life.

(John 6:35) Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never go hungry, and he who believes in me will never be thirsty.

(John 6:39) And this is the will of him who sent me, that I shall lose none of all that he has given me, but raise them up at the last day.

(John 6:68) Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.

(John 8:12) When Jesus spoke again to the people, he said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."

(John 8:31) To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples.

(John 8:32) Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

(John 10:11) "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.

(John 10:14) "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me--

(John 10:27) My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me.

(John 10:28) I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand.

(John 12:36) Put your trust in the light while you have it, so that you may become sons of light." When he had finished speaking, Jesus left and hid himself from them.

(John 13:17) Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them.

(John 14:6) Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

(John 14:15) "If you love me, you will obey what I command.

(John 14:21) Whoever has my commands and obeys them, he is the one who loves me. He who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love him and show myself to him."

(John 14:27) Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.

(John 15:5) "I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.

(John 15:9) "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love.

(John 15:10) If you obey my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have obeyed my Father's commands and remain in his love.

(John 17:3) Now this is eternal life: that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent.

(John 17:11) I will remain in the world no longer, but they are still in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them by the power of your name--the name you gave me--so that they may be one as we are one.

(John 17:15) My prayer is not that you take them out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one.

(John 17:17) Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth.

(John 18:37) "You are a king, then!" said Pilate. Jesus answered, "You are right in saying I am a king. In fact, for this reason I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me."

(Acts 4:12) Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved."

(Acts 10:35) but accepts men from every nation who fear him and do what is right.

(Acts 20:32) "Now I commit you to God and to the word of his grace, which can build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified.

(Acts 24:16) So I strive always to keep my conscience clear before God and man.

(Romans 1:16) I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile.

(Romans 6:11) In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

(Romans 6:12) Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its evil desires.

(Romans 8:6) The mind of sinful man is death, but the mind controlled by the Spirit is life and peace;

(Romans 8:14) because those who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God.

(Romans 8:38) For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers,

(Romans 8:39) neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

(Romans 10:9) That if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.

(Romans 10:11) As the Scripture says, "Anyone who trusts in him will never be put to shame."

(Romans 12:2) Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is--his good, pleasing and perfect will.

(Romans 12:12) Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer.

(Romans 12:21) Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

(Romans 14:8) If we live, we live to the Lord; and if we die, we die to the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord.

(Romans 14:17) For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit,

(Romans 15:13) May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

(1 Corinthians 1:8) He will keep you strong to the end, so that you will be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.

(1 Corinthians 1:9) God, who has called you into fellowship with his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, is faithful.

(1 Corinthians 1:30) It is because of him that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God--that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption.

(1 Corinthians 3:16) Don't you know that you yourselves are God's temple and that God's Spirit lives in you?

(1 Corinthians 3:17) If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy him; for God's temple is sacred, and you are that temple.

(1 Corinthians 6:20) you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your body.

(1 Corinthians 7:23) You were bought at a price; do not become slaves of men.

(1 Corinthians 10:12) So, if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall!

(1 Corinthians 13:13) And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.

(1 Corinthians 14:20) Brothers, stop thinking like children. In regard to evil be infants, but in your thinking be adults.

(1 Corinthians 15:58) Therefore, my dear brothers, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain.

(1 Corinthians 16:13) Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be men of courage; be strong.

(2 Corinthians 1:21) Now it is God who makes both us and you stand firm in Christ. He anointed us,

(2 Corinthians 1:22) set his seal of ownership on us, and put his Spirit in our hearts as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come.

(2 Corinthians 5:10) For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive what is due him for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad.

(2 Corinthians 6:1) As God's fellow workers we urge you not to receive God's grace in vain.

(2 Corinthians 6:18) "I will be a Father to you, and you will be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty."

(2 Corinthians 7:1) Since we have these promises, dear friends, let us purify ourselves from everything that contaminates body and spirit, perfecting holiness out of reverence for God.

(2 Corinthians 8:5) And they did not do as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then to us in keeping with God's will.

(2 Corinthians 9:6) Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously.

(2 Corinthians 12:9) But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me.

(2 Corinthians 13:14) May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

(Galatians 2:20) I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.

(Galatians 5:16) So I say, live by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the sinful nature.

(Galatians 5:22) But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,

(Galatians 5:24) Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the sinful nature with its passions and desires.

(Galatians 6:7) Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows.

(Galatians 6:8) The one who sows to please his sinful nature, from that nature will reap destruction; the one who sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life.

(Galatians 6:9) Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.

(Ephesians 1:3) Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ.

(Ephesians 2:10) For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

(Ephesians 3:14) For this reason I kneel before the Father,

(Ephesians 3:15) from whom his whole family in heaven and on earth derives its name.

(Ephesians 3:16) I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being,

(Ephesians 3:17) so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love,

(Ephesians 3:18) may have power, together with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ,

(Ephesians 3:19) and to know this love that surpasses knowledge--that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.

(Ephesians 3:20) Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us,

(Ephesians 3:21) to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.

(Ephesians 4:1) As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received.

(Ephesians 5:8) For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light

(Ephesians 5:17) Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is.

(Philippians 1:6) being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.

(Philippians 1:9) And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight,

(Philippians 1:10) so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless until the day of Christ,

(Philippians 1:11) filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ--to the glory and praise of God.

(Philippians 2:5) Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus:

(Philippians 3:12) Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me.

(Philippians 3:14) I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.

(Philippians 4:8) Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable--if anything is excellent or praiseworthy--think about such things.

(Colossians 2:6) So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live in him,

(Colossians 2:7) rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness.

(Colossians 3:2) Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things.

(Colossians 3:17) And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

(1 Thessalonians 2:11) For you know that we dealt with each of you as a father deals with his own children,

(1 Thessalonians 2:12) encouraging, comforting and urging you to live lives worthy of God, who calls you into his kingdom and glory.

(1 Thessalonians 4:3) It is God's will that you should be sanctified: that you should avoid sexual immorality;

(1 Thessalonians 5:23) May God himself, the God of peace, sanctify you through and through. May your whole spirit, soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

(1 Thessalonians 5:24) The one who calls you is faithful and he will do it.

(2 Thessalonians 2:16) May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and by his grace gave us eternal encouragement and good hope,

(2 Thessalonians 2:17) encourage your hearts and strengthen you in every good deed and word.

(1 Timothy 1:5) The goal of this command is love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.

(1 Timothy 4:8) For physical training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come.

(1 Timothy 6:11) But you, man of God, flee from all this, and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance and gentleness.

(1 Timothy 6:12) Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called when you made your good confession in the presence of many witnesses.

(1 Timothy 6:13) In the sight of God, who gives life to everything, and of Christ Jesus, who while testifying before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you

(1 Timothy 6:14) to keep this command without spot or blame until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ,

(2 Timothy 1:8) So do not be ashamed to testify about our Lord, or ashamed of me his prisoner. But join with me in suffering for the gospel, by the power of God,

(2 Timothy 2:3) Endure hardship with us like a good soldier of Christ Jesus.

(2 Timothy 2:5) Similarly, if anyone competes as an athlete, he does not receive the victor's crown unless he competes according to the rules.

(2 Timothy 2:19) Nevertheless, God's solid foundation stands firm, sealed with this inscription: "The Lord knows those who are his," and, "Everyone who confesses the name of the Lord must turn away from wickedness."

(2 Timothy 2:22) Flee the evil desires of youth, and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart.

(2 Timothy 3:14) But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it,

(2 Timothy 3:15) and how from infancy you have known the holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.

(Philemon 1:4) I always thank my God as I remember you in my prayers,

(Philemon 1:5) because I hear about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints.

(Philemon 1:6) I pray that you may be active in sharing your faith, so that you will have a full understanding of every good thing we have in Christ.

(Hebrews 3:7) So, as the Holy Spirit says: "Today, if you hear his voice,

(Hebrews 3:8) do not harden your hearts as you did in the rebellion, during the time of testing in the desert,

(Hebrews 10:23) Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful.

(Hebrews 10:38) But my righteous one will live by faith. And if he shrinks back, I will not be pleased with him."

(Hebrews 10:39) But we are not of those who shrink back and are destroyed, but of those who believe and are saved.

(Hebrews 11:6) And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.

(Hebrews 12:14) Make every effort to live in peace with all men and to be holy; without holiness no one will see the Lord.

(Hebrews 13:8) Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.

(Hebrews 13:9) Do not be carried away by all kinds of strange teachings. It is good for our hearts to be strengthened by grace, not by ceremonial foods, which are of no value to those who eat them.

(Hebrews 13:14) For here we do not have an enduring city, but we are looking for the city that is to come.

(Hebrews 13:20) May the God of peace, who through the blood of the eternal covenant brought back from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep,

(Hebrews 13:21) equip you with everything good for doing his will, and may he work in us what is pleasing to him, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

(James 1:12) Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial, because when he has stood the test, he will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love him.

(James 1:22) Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says.

(James 3:13) Who is wise and understanding among you? Let him show it by his good life, by deeds done in the humility that comes from wisdom.

(James 4:7) Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.

(James 4:8) Come near to God and he will come near to you. Wash your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded.

(1 Peter 1:25) but the word of the Lord stands forever." And this is the word that was preached to you.

(1 Peter 2:9) But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.

(1 Peter 3:15) But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect,

(1 Peter 5:8) Be self-controlled and alert. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour.

(1 Peter 5:9) Resist him, standing firm in the faith, because you know that your brothers throughout the world are undergoing the same kind of sufferings.

(1 Peter 5:10) And the God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm and steadfast.

(1 Peter 5:11) To him be the power for ever and ever. Amen.

(2 Peter 3:18) But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and forever! Amen.

(1 John 1:7) But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.

(1 John 2:15) Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

(1 John 2:24) See that what you have heard from the beginning remains in you. If it does, you also will remain in the Son and in the Father.

(1 John 2:25) And this is what he promised us--even eternal life.

(1 John 2:28) And now, dear children, continue in him, so that when he appears we may be confident and unashamed before him at his coming.

(1 John 3:1) How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him.

(1 John 3:7) Dear children, do not let anyone lead you astray. He who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

(1 John 3:18) Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth.

(1 John 4:19) We love because he first loved us.

(1 John 5:3) This is love for God: to obey his commands. And his commands are not burdensome,

(2 John 1:8) Watch out that you do not lose what you have worked for, but that you may be rewarded fully.

(2 John 1:9) Anyone who runs ahead and does not continue in the teaching of Christ does not have God; whoever continues in the teaching has both the Father and the Son.

(3 John 1:4) I have no greater joy than to hear that my children are walking in the truth.

(3 John 1:11) Dear friend, do not imitate what is evil but what is good. Anyone who does what is good is from God. Anyone who does what is evil has not seen God.

(Jude 1:20) But you, dear friends, build yourselves up in your most holy faith and pray in the Holy Spirit.

(Jude 1:21) Keep yourselves in God's love as you wait for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to bring you to eternal life.

(Revelation 3:10) Since you have kept my command to endure patiently, I will also keep you from the hour of trial that is going to come upon the whole world to test those who live on the earth.

(Revelation 3:11) I am coming soon. Hold on to what you have, so that no one will take your crown.

(Revelation 3:21) To him who overcomes, I will give the right to sit with me on my throne, just as I overcame and sat down with my Father on his throne.

(Revelation 7:13) Then one of the elders asked me, "These in white robes--who are they, and where did they come from?"

(Revelation 7:14) I answered, "Sir, you know." And he said, "These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

(Revelation 16:15) "Behold, I come like a thief! Blessed is he who stays awake and keeps his clothes with him, so that he may not go naked and be shamefully exposed."

(Revelation 21:7) He who overcomes will inherit all this, and I will be his God and he will be my son.

(Revelation 21:14) The wall of the city had twelve foundations, and on them were the names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.
